

• 6 cups zucchini (Note: Extra large zucchini are

best because they're firmer.)

- 1 ¼ cups sugar
- 1 ½ Tbsp flour

Pare zucchini. Wash and slice lengthwise. Remove seeds. Slice like apples. Add a little water and bring to boil in large sauce pan. Simmer about 15 min. or until tender. Cool and drain well. Add rest of ingredients and place in unbaked 9 inch pie crust. Cover with top pie crust and flute to seal edges. Cut slits in top of crust for steam to escape. Bake at 350° for 45 – 60 minutes. **Enjoy!**

Regularly washing your sheets helps maintain their quality and prolong their lifespan. Dirt and oils can break down fabric fibers over time.



Unique Situation, Separate Finances?

My fiancé and I are getting married this year. We're both in our 40s with kids, so we'll be a blended family. The thing that worries me is that we have drastically different views on handling money. I'm a saver, and he's a spender. I also make significantly more money than he does. He's been trying to get his production company in Tampa off the ground for about 10 years, making \$50,000 a year. I'm an accountant, and I make \$300,000 a year. Considering the uniqueness of the situation, would it be easier for us to keep separate financial lives? I've got a feeling it's going to be hard talking him into being more responsible with money at his age. —Lisa

Either you folks are going to do the hard work of getting on the same page together, or you're going to essentially work against each other and underperform. In your lives and your finances.

All the data we've collected shows that the couple who win with money are the couples who work together. Nearly 80% of the 10,000+ millionaires we interviewed in "The National Study of Millionaires" were married. On top of that, 80% of them said they were able to build that kind of wealth because they were working together financially with their spouse, instead of despite their spouse.

As far as your fiancé and his business are concerned, it doesn't take 10 years to get a business off the ground. If you know your stuff, it takes about 10 months. So, he doesn't really have a small business. He has a hobby. Don't get me wrong. I admire the dude's commitment and ambitious spirit. It may just be a case of him being good at what he does but not being good at running a business. Accidental entrepreneurs happen a lot, and that's not a sin. He may just need to educate himself on the how of running a business successfully.

Along those lines, I'd recommend that he pick up a copy of "The E-Myth" by Michael E. Gerber. It's a great read for anyone looking to evaluate their small business and get it moving in the right direction. But if that's not the answer, he needs to find a different career. The awkwardness of you making literally six times what he makes — and his business situation — needs to be discussed with a good pre-marital counselor before you two walk down the aisle. Applesauce Cake

- ½ cup butter
- 1 tsp soda
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup hot applesauce
- ½ tsp cloves
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 2 cup flour • ½ tsp salt
- ½ tsp nutmeg
- ½ cup raisins, optional
- ½ cup currants

Cream butter. Add sugar and mix until well blended. Mix spices, soda, and salt with flour. Add raisins to flour mixture. Add dry ingredients and apple sauce alternately to creamed mixture. Stir until smooth. Pour into greased and flour-dusted oblong 6" x 10" cake pan. Bake 45 minutes in 350° oven. Turn out of pan. Cool. Serve either plain or iced. Enjoy!




Amazing "Animals"







Condiment Confusion


That little touch of tomato-y goodness you dip your fries into and the creamy sauce that makes your chicken salad smooth and tasty may seem like minor grace notes in the symphony of foods you eat every day. But ketchup — or catsup, depending on where you're from — can be loaded with food felons.

Ketchup was once considered a cure-all for indigestion, jaundice and rheumatism. Today, the typical American downs about 175 ounces (10-plus pounds) a year — and while the lycopene in cooked tomatoes decreases inflammation, cardiovascular diseases, and dementia, the way ketchup is usually prepared may cure nothing. Instead, it delivers high fructose corn syrup and plain corn syrup (8 grams total per tablespoon), which contribute to fatty liver and unhealthy levels of lipids in the blood. (Look for low- or no-sugar and fructose-free ketchup.)

Commercially prepared mayo is also a diet saboteur. It's usually made with GMO soybean oil (loaded with omega-6s) and preservatives, sugar and texturizers. Excess omega-6s in the American diet contribute to inflammation and gut woes. (You can make mayo with olive oil, lemon, and eggs if you need a little bit — don't overdo it.)

Good news? Must-have mustard delivers goodness to sandwiches, chicken dishes and salad dressings. Three ounces contains a hit of magnesium, some vitamin Bs and vitamin A, and dash of amino acids, minerals and other phytonutrients.
